H.R. 3497, to expand the boundary of the Snoqualmie National Forest amended (H. Rept. 104–816);

H.R. 3632, to amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to repeal the requirement for annual resident review for nursing facilities under the Medicaid Program and to require resident reviews for mentally ill or mentally retarded residents when there is a significant change in physical or mental condition (H. Rept. 104–817); and

H.R. 3633, to amend title XVIII and XIX of the Social Security Act to permit a waiver of the prohibition of offering nurse aide training and competency evaluation programs in certain nursing facilities (H. Rept. 104–818 Part I). Page H10767
