H. RES. 270

Mr. MARSHALL submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 303) to amend title 10, United States Code, to permit certain additional retired members of the Armed Forces who have a service-connected disability to receive both disability compensation from the Department of Veterans Affairs for their disability and either retired pay by reason of their years of military service or Combat-Related Special Compensation and to eliminate the phase-in period under current law with respect to such concurrent receipt.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker shall, pursuant to clause 2(b) of

1 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
2 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
3 ation of the bill (H.R. 303) to amend title 10, United
4 States Code, to permit certain additional retired members
5 of the Armed Forces who have a service-connected dis-
6 ability to receive both disability compensation from the
7 Department of Veterans Affairs for their disability and ei-
8 ther retired pay by reason of their years of military service
9 or Combat-Related Special Compensation and to eliminate
10 the phase-in period under current law with respect to such
11 concurrent receipt. The first reading of the bill shall be
12 dispensed with. All points of order against the bill and
13 against its consideration are waived (except those arising
14 under clause 7 of rule XVI). General debate shall be con-
15 fined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally di-
16 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-
17 ity member of the Committee on Veterans' Affairs. After
18 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
19 under the five-minute rule. The bill shall be considered
20 as read. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
21 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill
22 to the House with such amendments as may have been
23 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the
24 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of
25 the Whole to the bill. The previous question shall be con-

- 1 sidered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to
- 2 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-
- 3 tion to recommit with or without instructions.
