Mr. BYRD (for himself and Mr. ROCKEFELLER) introduced the following bill;
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Nat-
ural Resources

A BILL

To provide for the reinstatement of a license for a certain
Federal Energy Regulatory Commission project.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSE FOR FEDERAL**
4 **ENERGY REGULATORY COMMISSION**
5 **PROJECT.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding the time period
7 specified in section 13 of the Federal Power Act (16
8 U.S.C. 806) that would otherwise apply to project num-
9 bered 7307 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commis-
10 sion, the Commission shall, on the request of the licensee

1 for the project, in accordance with that section (including
2 the good faith, due diligence, and public interest require-
3 ments of that section and procedures established under
4 that section), extend the time required for commencement
5 of construction of the project until December 31, 2007.

6 (b) APPLICABILITY.—Subsection (a) shall apply to
7 the project on the expiration of any extension, issued by
8 the Commission under section 13 of the Federal Power
9 Act (16 U.S.C. 806), of the time required for commence-
10 ment of construction of the project.

11 (c) REINSTATEMENT OF EXPIRED LICENSE.—If a li-
12 cense of the Commission for the project expires before the
13 date of enactment of this Act, the Commission shall—

14 (1) reinstate the license effective as of the date
15 of the expiration of the license; and

16 (2) extend the time required for commencement
17 of construction of the project until December 31,
18 2007.
