#### A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to establish the Waco Mammoth National Monument in the State of Texas.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa				
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled				
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.				
4	This Act may be cited as the "Waco Mammoth Na				
5	tional Monument Establishment Act of 2009".				
6	SEC. 2. FINDINGS.				
7	Congress finds as follows:				
8	(1) The Waco Mammoth Site area is located				
9	near the confluence of the Brazos and the Bosque riv				
10	ers in Central Texas, near the City of Waco.				
11	(2) Baylor University has been investigating the				
12	2. site since 1978 after the discovery of bones emergin				
13	from eroding creek banks leading to the uncovering of				
14	portions of five mammoths.				
15	(3) Several additional mammoth remains have				
16	been uncovered making this the largest known con-				
17	centration of mammoths dying from the same event				
18	(4) The discoveries have received internationa				
19	attention.				
20	(5) The University and the City of Waco have				
21	been working together to protect the site and to de-				
22	velop further research and educational opportunities				
23	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.				
24	In this Act the following definitions apply:				

- 1 (1) National monument.—The term "national monument" means the Waco Mammoth National Monument, established in section 4.
- 4 (2) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means 5 the Secretary of the Interior.
- 6 (3) MAP.—The term "map" means the map ti-7 tled "Proposed Boundary Waco-Mammoth National 8 Monument", numbered T21/80,000, and dated April, 9 2009.

#### 10 SEC. 4. WACO MAMMOTH NATIONAL MONUMENT, TEXAS.

- 11 (a) Establishment.—There is established the Waco
- 12 Mammoth National Monument in the State of Texas, as a
- 13 unit of the National Park System, as generally depicted on
- 14 the map.
- 15 (b) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be on file
- 16 and available for public inspection in the appropriate of-
- 17 fices of the National Park Service.

#### 18 SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION OF NATIONAL MONUMENT.

- 19 (a) In General.—The Secretary shall administer the
- 20 national monument in accordance with this Act, the cooper-
- 21 ative agreements described in this section, and laws and
- 22 regulations generally applicable to units of the National
- 23 Park System, including the National Park Service Organic
- 24 Act (39 Stat. 535, 16 U.S.C. 1).

1	(b) Cooperative Agreements.—The Secretary may				
2	enter into cooperative agreements for the management of the				
3	national monument with Baylor University and City of				
4	Waco, pursuant to the National Park Service General Au-				
5	thorities Act (16 U.S.C. 1a-2(1)).				
6	SEC. 6. ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY AND BOUNDARY MAN				
7	AGEMENT.				
8	(a) Acquisition of Property.—The Secretary is au-				
9	thorized to acquire from willing sellers lands, or interests				
10	in lands, within the proposed boundary of the national				
11	monument necessary for effective management.				
12	(b) Conditions.—Lands identified in subsection (a)				
13	may be acquired—				
14	(1) by donation, purchase with donated or ap-				
15	propriated funds, transfer from another Federal agen-				
16	cy, or by exchange; and				
17	(2) in the case of lands owned by the State of				
18	Texas, or a political subdivision thereof, or Baylor				
19	University only by donation or exchange.				
20	SEC. 7. CONSTRUCTION OF FACILITIES ON NONFEDERAL				
21	LANDS.				
22	(a) In General.—The Secretary is authorized, subject				
23	to the appropriation of necessary funds, to construct essen-				
24	tial administrative or visitor use facilities on non-Federal				
25	lands within the national monument				

1	(b) Other Funding.—In addition to the use of Fed-				
2	eral funds authorized in subsection (a), the Secretary may				
3	use donated funds, property, and services to carry out this				
4	section.				
5	SEC. 8. GENERAL MANAGEMENT PLAN.				
6	(a) In General.—Not later than three years after the				
7	date on which funds are made available to carry out the				
8	3 Act, the Secretary, in consultation with Baylor Universit				
9	and City of Waco, shall prepare a management plan for				
10	the national monument.				
11	(b) Inclusions.—The management plan shall include,				
12	at a minimum—				
13	(1) measures for the preservation of the resources				
14	of the national monument;				
15	(2) requirements for the type and extent of devel-				
16	opment and use of the national monument;				
17	(3) identification of visitor carrying capacities				
18	for national monument; and				
19	(4) opportunities for involvement by Baylor				
20	University, the City of Waco, the State of Texas, and				
21	other local and national entities in the formulation of				
22	educational programs for the national monument and				
23	for developing and supporting the national monu-				
24	ment.				

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
