**Reports Filed:** A report was filed on November 25, 2013 as follows:

H.R. 3381, to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2014 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government, the Community Management Account, and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 113–277).

Reports were filed today as follows:

H.R. 1204, to amend title 49, United States Code, to direct the Assistant Secretary of Homeland Security (Transportation Security Administration) to establish an Aviation Security Advisory Committee, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 113–278);

H.R. 3309, to amend title 35, United States Code, and the Leahy-Smith America Invents Act to make improvements and technical corrections, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 113–279);

H.R. 298, to direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study to evaluate the significance of the Mill Springs Battlefield located in Pulaski and Wayne Counties, Kentucky, and the feasibility of its inclusion in the National Park System,

and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 113–280);

H.R. 1241, to facilitate a land exchange involving certain National Forest System lands in the Inyo National Forest, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 113–281); and

H.R. 1846, to amend the Act establishing the Lower East Side Tenement National Historic Site, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 113–282). **Pages H7393–94**

**Space Launch Liability Indemnification Extension Act:** H.R. 3547, to extend the application of certain space launch liability provisions through 2014, by a  $\frac{2}{3}$  yeas-and-nays vote of 376 yeas to 5 nays, Roll No. 612 and **Pages H7369–71, H7373–74**

**Community Fire Safety Act of 2013:** H.R. 3588, to amend the Safe Drinking Water Act to exempt fire hydrants from the prohibition on the use of lead pipes, fittings, fixtures, solder, and flux, by a  $\frac{2}{3}$  yeas-and-nays vote of 384 yeas with none voting "nay", Roll No. 613. **Pages H7371–73, H7374**

**Recess:** The House recessed at 5:38 p.m. and reconvened at 6:30 p.m. **Page H7373**
