### H.R.6690

#### AN ACT

To establish a smart card pilot program to combat fraud, waste, and abuse and to protect beneficiary identity under the Medicare program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Fighting Fraud to Pro-
- 3 tect Care for Seniors Act of 2018".
- 4 SEC. 2. MEDICARE SMART CARD PILOT PROGRAM.
- 5 Part E of title XVIII of the Social Security Act is
- 6 amended by inserting after section 1866E the following
- 7 new section:
- 8 "SEC. 1866F. SMART CARD PILOT PROGRAM.
- 9 "(a) Implementation.—
- 10 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 36 months
- after the date of the enactment of this section, the
- 12 Secretary shall establish a pilot program (in this sec-
- tion referred to as the 'pilot program') to evaluate
- the feasibility of using smart card technology under
- this title.
- 16 "(2) Smart card technology defined.—In
- this section, the term 'smart card technology' means
- the following:
- 19 "(A) BENEFICIARY SMART CARD.—A ma-
- chine readable, tamper-resistant card (in this
- section referred to as a 'smart card') that in-
- cludes an embedded integrated circuit chip with
- a secure micro-controller (as defined by the Na-
- 24 tional Institute on Standards and Technology)
- 25 that enables the verification and secure, elec-
- tronic authentication of the identity of a Medi-

care beneficiary at the point of service through
a combination of the smart card and a personal
identification number known by or associated
with such beneficiary.

- "(B) CARD READER TECHNOLOGY.—Information technology that enables a supplier and provider to authenticate the identity of a Medicare beneficiary through presentation of such a smart card and such components, with such authentication to be reflected through the use of a modifier or in another appropriate manner, as determined by the Secretary, in the claims adjudication process.
- "(3) Program design elements.—The pilot program shall be conducted for a period of 3 years consistent with the following:
  - "(A) SELECTION OF AREA.—In consultation with the Inspector General of the Department of Health and Human Services, the Secretary shall select at least three geographic areas in which the pilot program will operate.
  - "(B) SELECTION OF SUPPLIER AND PRO-VIDER TYPES.—In consultation with the Inspector General of the Department of Health and Human Services, the Secretary shall select sup-

1	plier and provider types that will be required to
2	participate in the pilot program (referred to in
3	this section as 'participating suppliers and pro-
4	viders'). In selecting such supplier and provider
5	types, the Secretary shall—
6	"(i) take into account the risk of
7	fraud, waste, and abuse (as described in
8	section 1866(j)(2)(B)) with respect to the
9	category of provider or supplier) and other
10	factors as determined appropriate by the
11	Secretary; and
12	"(ii) limit the pilot program to no
13	more than 2,000 suppliers and providers.
14	"(C) Supplier and provider hardship
15	EXEMPTIONS.—The Secretary shall exempt
16	from participation in the pilot program a sup-
17	plier or provider that either—
18	"(i) does not have access to card read-
19	er technology (as described in paragraph
20	(2)(B));
21	"(ii) does not have sufficient internet
22	access; or
23	"(iii) has a low volume (as determined
24	by the Secretary) of Medicare claims for
25	which payment is made under this title.

1	"(D) SMART CARD AND SMART CARD
2	READER ISSUANCE.—
3	"(i) Beneficiary smart card
4	ISSUANCE.—The Secretary shall provide
5	for, at no cost, the issuance (and, if nec-
6	essary, replacement) of beneficiary smart
7	cards described in paragraph (2)(A) to all
8	Medicare beneficiaries residing in a geo-
9	graphic area in which the pilot program is
10	conducted under subparagraph (A). Infor-
11	mation that appears on Medicare cards
12	used outside the pilot program may appear
13	on the face of the beneficiary smart card.
14	"(ii) Supplier and provider smart
15	CARD READER ISSUANCE.—At the request
16	of a participating supplier or provider, the
17	Secretary shall provide for, at no cost, the
18	issuance to such supplier or provider of
19	smart card hardware and software nec-
20	essary to participate in the pilot program.
21	"(E) Information on operation of
22	PILOT PROGRAM.—The Secretary shall provide
23	participating suppliers and providers and Medi-
24	care beneficiaries who are furnished items and
25	services by such suppliers and providers, with

1	information on the operation of the pilot pro-
2	gram, including privacy protections described in
3	subparagraph (I).
4	"(F) Access to services outside the
5	PILOT PROGRAM.—
6	"(i) Beneficiaries.—Medicare bene-
7	ficiaries who receive beneficiary smart
8	cards may receive items and services from
9	suppliers and providers not participating in
10	the pilot program.
11	"(ii) Suppliers and provider
12	CLAIMS.—
13	"(I) Suppliers and providers
14	NOT PARTICIPATING IN PILOT.—Sup-
15	pliers and providers not participating
16	in the pilot program may submit
17	claims under this title for items and
18	services furnished without use of
19	smart card technology to Medicare
20	beneficiaries who receive beneficiary
21	smart cards.
22	"(II) Participating suppliers
23	AND PROVIDERS FURNISHING SERV-
24	ICES TO NON-PARTICIPATING BENE-
25	FICIARIES.—Supplier and providers

1	participating in the pilot program may
2	submit claims under this title for
3	items and services furnished to Medi-
4	care beneficiaries who do not receive
5	beneficiary smart cards.
6	"(G) CLARIFICATION ON ACCESS TO SERV-
7	ICES WITHOUT SMART CARDS.—In the case of a
8	Medicare beneficiary who receives a beneficiary
9	smart card and does not present such card at
10	the time of receipt of items or services from a
11	participating supplier or provider, the partici-
12	pating supplier or provider—
13	"(i) shall furnish such items or serv-
14	ices to such Medicare beneficiary as if such
15	beneficiary does present such card;
16	"(ii) may submit claims under this
17	title for such items or services; and
18	"(iii) shall provide, in accordance with
19	such manner, process, and timing as speci-
20	fied by the Secretary, information to the
21	Secretary (through the contractor de-
22	scribed in subparagraph (H)) that such
23	beneficiary received such a smart card but
24	did not have the smart card at the time
25	the items or services were furnished.

- "(H) Private SECTOR IMPLEMENTA-TION.—The Secretary shall select, by using a competitive procurement process in accordance with the provisions of chapter 1 of title 48, Code of Federal Regulations (or any successor regulations), a private sector contractor to im-plement and operate the pilot program.
  - "(I) Privacy protections.—The Secretary shall ensure that the pilot program complies with applicable Federal laws and regulations concerning individually identifiable health information, including the Privacy Act of 1974 and regulations promulgated under section 264(c) of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and such individually identifiable information shall be exempt from disclosure under section 552(b)(3) of title 5, United States Code.
  - "(J) Mandatory participation.—Subject to subparagraph (C), in the case of items or services furnished by a provider or supplier included in a supplier or provider type selected under subparagraph (B) in a geographic area selected under subparagraph (A), payment may only be made under this title for such items or

services during the period of the pilot program if the provider or supplier is participating in the pilot program.

"(K) Prohibition of Smart Card Fees.—No transaction, utilization, or other fees may be imposed on Medicare beneficiaries or participating suppliers and providers with respect to the use of smart cards under the pilot program.

#### "(4) Stakeholder input.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 6 months after the date of the enactment of this section, the Secretary shall convene a panel consisting of stakeholders (including representatives of providers, suppliers, technology vendors, Medicare beneficiaries, and claims processing contractors) selected by the Secretary for purposes of providing input to the Secretary on the implementation of the pilot program (including on the selection of areas and participants under subparagraphs (A) and (B) of paragraph (3) and the development of exemptions and requirements described in such paragraph).

"(B) Nonapplicability of faca.—The Federal Advisory Committee Act shall not apply

1 to the panel convened pursuant to subpara-2 graph (A). 3 "(5) Definitions.—In this section: "(A) The terms 'supplier' and 'provider' 4 5 have the meanings given the terms 'supplier' 6 and 'provider of services' in subsections (d) and 7 (u), respectively, of section 1861. 8 "(B) The term 'Medicare beneficiary' 9 means an individual who is enrolled in the origi-10 Medicare fee-for-service program under 11 parts A and B and is not enrolled in an MA plan under part C, an eligible organization 12 13 under section 1876, or a PACE program under 14 section 1894. 15 "(b) Reports to Congress.—The Secretary shall submit to Congress the following reports: 16 "(1) Interim Performance Report.—Not 17 18 later than 2 years after the date the pilot program 19 is implemented, an interim report on the perform-20 ance of such program. "(2) Final Performance Report.—Not later 21 22 than 18 months after the date of the completion of 23 the pilot program, a final evaluation on the effective-24 ness of the pilot program. The report shall include 25 the following:

1	"(A) An evaluation of the effect of the
2	pilot program on potential fraud under the in-
3	surance programs established under this title.
4	"(B) A description of any barriers to im-
5	plementation of the pilot program.
6	"(C) Participant feedback on the pilot pro-
7	gram.
8	"(D) Recommendations regarding the fu-
9	ture use of smart cards to address fraud under
10	this title.
11	"(E) Data on the information provided
12	under subsection (a)(3)(G)(iii).".
