**Further Continuing Appropriations Resolutions:** The House passed H.J. Res. 118, making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2001 by

a yeas and nays vote of 339 yeas to 7 nays, Roll No. 571.

H. Res. 646, the rule that provided for consideration of the joint resolution was agreed to on Oct. 25, 2000.

**Motions to Instruct Conferees—Labor, HHS, Education Appropriations:** Agreed to the DeLauro motion to instruct conferees on H.R. 4577, Labor, HHS, Education Appropriations to insist on the highest funding level possible for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program by a yeas and nays vote of 305 yeas to 18 nays, Roll No. 572. Subsequently, then rejected the Lowey motion to instruct conferees, on the same bill, to disagree with provisions which deny the President's request for dedicated resources to reduce class sizes in the early grades and for local school construction and instead broadly expands the title VI Education Block Grant with limited accountability in the use of funds by

a yea and nay vote of 150 yeas to 159 nays, Roll No. 573.

# Congressional Record

The public proceedings of each House of Congress, as reported by the Official Reporters thereof, are printed pursuant to directions of the Joint Committee on Printing as authorized by appropriate provisions of Title 44, United States Code, and published for each day that one or both Houses are in session, excepting very infrequent instances when two or more unusually small consecutive issues are printed at one time. ¶Public access to the Congressional Record is available online through *GPO Access*, a service of the Government Printing Office, free of charge to the user. The online database is updated each day the Congressional Record is published. The database includes both text and graphics from the beginning of the 103d Congress, 2d session (January 1994) forward. It is available on the Wide Area Information Server (WAIS) through the Internet and via asynchronous dial-in. Internet users can access the database by using the World Wide Web; the Superintendent of Documents home page address is <http://www.access.gpo.gov/su/docs>, by using local WAIS client software or by telnet to [swais.access.gpo.gov](http://swais.access.gpo.gov), then login as guest (no password required). Dial-in users should use communications software and modem to call (202) 512-1661; type swais, then login as guest (no password required).
