

Representative Obey to recommit the joint resolution to the Committee on Appropriations with instructions to report it back to the House forthwith with an amendment that provided an additional \$3.5 billion for state and local first responders homeland security grants and an additional \$90 million for health screening and long-term medical monitoring of emergency response and recovery personnel exposed to toxic substances at the World Trade Center site. Representative Putnam raised the point of order stating that the proposed motion violated section 302(c) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974.

President Bush's State of the Union Address: President George W. Bush delivered his State of the Union address to a joint session of Congress, pursuant to the provisions of H. Con. Res. 12. He was escorted into the House Chamber by a committee comprised of Representatives DeLay, Pryce, Cox, Kingston, Pelosi, Hoyer, Menendez, Clyburn and Senators Frist, McConnell, Santorum, Kyl, Allen, Warner, Daschle, Reid of Nevada, Mikulski, and Breaux. The President's message was referred to the Committee of the Whole House on the State of the Union and ordered printed as a House Document (H. Doc. 108–1).
