

with the time equally divided and controlled between Senators Harkin and Isakson, or their designees; that upon the use or yielding back of time, Senate vote on adoption of the motion to proceed; that if the motion is successful, then there be 1 hour of debate with respect to the joint resolution, with the time divided as indicated above; that upon the use or yielding back of time, the joint resolution be read for a third time, and Senate vote on passage of the joint resolution; provided further, that if the motion to proceed is defeated, then no further motion to proceed to the joint resolution be in order; provided further, that no amendments or any other motions be in order to the joint resolution and all other provisions of the statute governing consideration of the joint resolution remaining in effect during the pendency of this agreement. **Pages S7300–01**
