Lohier and Reeves Nominations—Agreement: A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that on Sunday, December 19, 2010, following any vote with respect to the Risch Amendment to the START Treaty; that the Senate proceed to consideration of the following nominations: Raymond Joseph Lohier, Jr., of New York, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Second Circuit, and Carlton W. Reeves, of Mississippi, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Mississippi; and vote immediately on confirmation of the nominations, with 2 minutes of debate prior to each confirmation vote, equally divided and controlled between Senators Leahy and Sessions, or their designees; further, that after the first vote in this sequence, the succeeding votes be limited to 10 minutes each. **Page S10704**

Pearson and Martinez Nominations—Agreement: A unanimous-consent-time agreement was reached providing that at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, following consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate will proceed to Executive Session to consider the following nominations: Benita Y. Pearson, of Ohio, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Ohio; and William Joseph Martinez, of Colorado, to be United States District Judge for the District of Colorado; that debate on each nomination be limited to 60 minutes, equally divided and controlled between Senators Leahy and Sessions, or their designees; that upon the use or yielding back of all time, the Senate then vote on confirmation of the nominations in the order listed; that prior to the sec-

ond vote, there be 2 minutes of debate, divided as specified above; that the second vote be limited to 10 minutes. **Page S10704**
