Food and Drug Administration Safety and Innovation Act—Agreement: By 89 yeas to 3 nays (Vote No. 166), three-fifths of those Senators duly chosen and sworn, having voted in the affirmative, Senate agreed to the motion to close further debate on Reid motion to concur in the amendment of the House of Representatives to S. 3187, to amend the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act to revise and extend the user-fee programs for prescription drugs and medical devices, to establish user-fee programs for generic drugs and biosimilars. **Page S4449**

A unanimous-consent-time agreement was reached providing that at 2:15 p.m., on Tuesday, June 26, 2012, there be 6 hours and 15 minutes of debate remaining post-cloture on the Reid motion to concur in the amendment of the House of Representatives to the bill, with 2 hours under the control of Senator

Harkin, 4 hours under the control of Senator Burr and 15 minutes under the control of Senator Paul.
