

Pursuant to the rule, the amendment printed in H. Rept. 113–216 shall be considered as adopted.

Page H5773

H. Res. 352, the rule providing for consideration of the joint resolution, was agreed to yesterday, September 19th.

Restoring Healthy Forests for Healthy Communities Act: The House passed H.R. 1526, to restore employment and educational opportunities in, and improve the economic stability of, counties containing National Forest System land, while also reducing Forest Service management costs, by ensuring that such counties have a dependable source of revenue from National Forest System land, and to provide a temporary extension of the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000, by a recorded vote of 244 ayes to 173 noes, Roll No. 483. Consideration of the measure began yesterday, September 19th.

Pages H5788–92

Rejected the Barber motion to recommit the bill to the Committee on Natural Resources with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith with an amendment, by a recorded vote of 190 ayes to 228 noes, Roll No. 482.

Pages H5790–91

Agreed to:

Daines amendment (No. 1 printed in part C of H. Rept. 113–215) that was debated on September 19th that protects forest reserve projects from delay by precluding Court-issued injunctions based on alleged violations of procedural requirements in selecting, planning, or analyzing the project (by a recorded vote of 219 ayes to 196 noes, Roll No. 479);

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McClintock amendment (No. 3 printed in part C of H. Rept. 113–215) that was debated on September 19th that waives judicial review on any timber salvage project resulting from a wildfire occurring in 2013 (by a recorded vote of 243 ayes to 172 noes, Roll No. 480); and

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McClintock amendment (No. 5 printed in part C of H. Rept. 113–215) that was debated on September 19th that prohibits the U.S. Forest Service from removing any roads or trails unless there has been a specific decision, which included adequate and appropriate public involvement, to decommission the specific road or trail in question (by a recorded vote of 249 ayes to 166 noes, Roll No. 481).

Pages H5789–90

H. Res. 351, the rule providing for consideration of the bills (H.R. 687), (H.R. 1526), and (H.R. 3102) was agreed to yesterday, September 19th.
